

DIRECTIONS TO NILES NORTH HIGH SCHOOL, SKOKIE, IL

From the North:

1. Take I-94 Edens Expressway **EAST**
2. Take the Old Orchard Rd. exit, **EXIT 35**
3. Turn **LEFT** onto Old Orchard Rd & go over the bridge spanning the highway.
4. Turn **RIGHT** onto the **FIRST** street on your right **LAWLER AVENUE**. **NILES NORTH** will be on your immediate right.
5. Enter the parking lot on your immediate right.

From the West or Northwest, via Interstate 88, Interstate 90 or Interstate 190:

1. Take I-88, I-90 or I-190 Eastbound until you reach Northbound I-294 (heading toward Wisconsin)
2. Take I-294 North toward WISCONSIN 6.0 mi
3. Take Dempster Street Exit **EAST(37B)**
4. Turn **LEFT** onto N. Greenwood Ave 1.0 mi
5. Turn **RIGHT** onto **W. GOLF RD/IL-58**
6. Continue to follow **W. GOLF RD** 4.5 mi
7. Turn **LEFT** onto **LAWLER AVE** 0.3 mi **NILES NORTH** will be on your left.
8. Enter the parking lot north of the school.

From the West or Southwest, via Interstate 55 or Interstate 80 to I-94:

1. If coming in on eastbound I-80, follow I-80 until the interchange with I-55; take northbound I-55.
2. Follow northbound I-55 until the interchange with I-90/I-94; take northbound I-90/I-94 (Kennedy Expressway).
3. When I-94 splits from I-90, bear to the right, staying on I-94 W (Edens Expressway).
4. Take I-94 North to Dempster Street East Exit (37B)
5. Turn **LEFT** onto N. Greenwood Ave. 1.0 mi
6. Turn **RIGHT** onto **W. GOLF RD/IL-58**
7. Continue to follow **W GOLF RD** 4.5 mi
8. Turn **LEFT** onto **LAWLER AVE** 0.3 mi **NILES NORTH** will be on your left.
9. Enter the parking lot north of the school.

To enter Niles North, use the **MAIN ENTRANCE (#2)** on the north end of the school.



*L'Hôpital Rothschild pendant le Gouvernement Vichy: A look at the role of the Rothschild Hospital during the Vichy Government, and its transformation into an internment camp within Paris.
